KLC School Partnerships Announces Availability of Champions Online Tutoring for School Districts Nationwide

Flexible, individualized program aims to help improve math skills of students in grades 4-8

Denver, Colo. – February 3, 2009 – KLC School Partnerships announced today the availability of its newest academic intervention program for school districts nationwide: Champions Online Tutoring, an interactive web-based offering that addresses the unique math needs of children in grades 4-8. The program is designed with convenience and flexibility for schools in mind, with the ability to determine the length of program based upon their individual student needs, and to host 60-minute sessions directly on-site, or at a distance.

“We’re not your traditional distance learning offering,” says Pete Cassidy, Director of online programs for School Partnerships. “Champions offers live, synchronous events in which instructors and students can easily communicate in real time. And, while other programs focus on either academic intervention *or* accelerated learning, Champions can address either need. Whether for a student who wants to brush up on their math skills before the new school year, or one who is struggling in a particular subject area, our program creates learning plans customized for every student to follow at their own pace.”

Customized lessons for remedial or accelerated needs

Upon enrollment, every student completes an adaptive pretest, which accurately pinpoints skill gaps and areas of strength. Results are compiled to determine individualized learning plans. These learning plans are taken from School Partnerships’ research-based curriculum; seventy-five lessons have been modified for the online program. These lessons provide a proven scope and sequence for grade levels 4-8. Alignment reports to state standards are available for lessons on every instructional level. Student progress is measurable throughout the duration of the program and with the completion of a post-test at the program’s conclusion, which outlines skills developed and continued areas for growth.

Live, interactive sessions led by qualified instructors

To assist students during the program, qualified educators lead tutoring sessions via an interactive Web portal. “With an online offering, we’ve been able to tap into a pool of

talented instructors from across the U.S.," says Cassidy. "This enables us to hire the right instructors with the credentials needed to effectively coach students in all areas of math."

The program's teacher-to-student ratio is 4:1 with instructors providing individual attention and support to each student including English language learners or those with special needs. Verbal interaction is encouraged through headsets over a voice-over IP (VIOP) configuration. In addition, there are a variety of on-screen tools available including a chat feature, a whiteboard drawing tool, a "raise hand" option for students to ask questions, and motivational stamps for teachers to provide positive feedback as they monitor students' work. All instructors initially complete significant training upon joining the program in order to prepare to work with students in the online platform. Follow up training sessions are also provided.

Buena Vista students log on to boost math skills

Champions Online Tutoring is a new chapter in KLC School Partnerships' strong history of offering academic intervention programs, which have historically yielded impressive academic gains for a variety of school districts. For instance in the 2007-2008 school year, students in School Partnerships' programs saw math scores rise 61 points as measured by pre- and post-assessment tests created by School Partnerships.

The Buena Vista school district located outside of Saginaw, Michigan, is the first to sign-up for the Champions online tutoring program. More than 35 students are currently enrolled with lessons underway.

Quiz results are categorized by grade level proficiency, with a perfect score placing users at the eighth-grade mathematics level, which includes pre-algebra and algebra objectives.
